SELF-STUDY COMMITTEE

The Self-Study Committee is gearing up to start taking a comprehensive look at the congregation, our history, and our future. This study is one of the steps in the search for a new pastor. The committee will seek your input for finding who we are and what God is calling us to be and to do. The committee will also look at demographic projections for the area in which we live and are the church. In addition to surveying the congregation, we will survey those in our neighborhood who know the needs of our community. From this information, we will seek a direction for the future of Lakeside. When we know that we will have a much clearer idea of what to look for in a pastor. Once elected, the Pastor Nominating Committee will use this information in their search.

The Roman stoic philosopher Seneca said, "If a sailor knows not to which port he sails, no wind is favorable." The self-study will help us know to which port we sail. Then we will not be at the mercy of the wind but can harness it to get us where God wants us to go.

The Session has elected **Mary Lou Blake, Tom Crutchfield, Denise Hanser, Jonathan Jones, Larry Lewis, Carla Smith,** and **Peter Teremi** to serve on the Self-Study Committee.

PIANO UPDATE!

One of the goals of the last few years has been to purchase a new piano to replace the one in the sanctuary, which has given us 30 years of service. That dream seemed distant with the extent and cost of the recent capital projects.

Then we recently had a wonderful opportunity and challenge. An anonymous donor offered a matching gift challenge of \$1 for \$2. This challenge would cover a third of the cost of the new piano, if we could raise the rest. Within three weeks the remaining balance was met by members by our congregation and members of outside organizations that use our sanctuary for rehearsals and performances: Northern Kentucky Community Chorus, Vocal Arts Ensemble of Cincinnati and the Linton Music Series Peanut Butter & Jam Sessions. These community groups felt compelled to contribute to this piano because of the musical outreach Lakeside provides to our community.

Delivery of this piano will be soon. We will enjoy its beautiful sound in worship services and in the upcoming "Sounds of the Season" concert by the Northern Kentucky Community Chorus concert on December 3.
