MARCH GIVING BARREL

The Giving Barrel for March is the Welcome House Homeless Shelter for Women and Children. The shelter served over 1,100 households in 2016 including 469 children. The goal of the shelter is finding housing and stability for these families. The shelter needs groceries for their clients and for feeding women and children at the shelter, which feeds 35 each night. These are the items most needed:

Canned Meat (chicken and tuna), Macaroni & Cheese, Uncooked Pasta Noodles, Powdered Creamer, Canned Vegetables w/ pull tab, Kool-ade mix, Lemonade mix, Canned Beans with pull tab, Hot Cocoa mix, Pasta Sauce, Condiments, Peanut Butter & Jelly, Instant rice, Cereal, Instant Mashed Potatoes, Instant Oatmeal, Kroger Gift Cards for perishable items, Large cans of veggies

Saturday, March 17th is our next visit to Open Door at the Church of the Advent in Walnut Hills. This Mission outreach needs at least 20 volunteers to make the client check in and food distribution run smoothly.
