World Cafe Summary (August 25, 2019)

Q1) What is Lakeside currently known for?

- Beautiful building/facility, including the organ
- Great music program
- Preschool with a great reputation
- A welcoming church
- We are known within different pockets of the community because we offer space to their groups to meet here
- A great Vacation Bible School
- Traditional worship service
- Some have said there is a lack of identity. We don't stand out for anything really and we are often confused for Lakeside Christian Church.

Q2) What do you want Lakeside to be known for?

- More diversity
- Welcoming to all/friendly, Loving and caring
- Great mission work
- Great programs for kids and youth
- Something for people of all ages
- Great music program, VBS and preschool

Q3) What are your dreams for within Lakeside?

- To be financially stable
- Small groups (whether by similar interests, ages, or neighborhoods)
- Adding more contemporary elements to our services (through music for example) or adding an extra contemporary service all together.
- Dedicated space for our youth
- Jr. church for children to attend after the children's sermon/Better ways to reach our kids
- Follow up on members who have not attended in a while to let them know we are thinking of them.
- Better communication within the church (added to website, Twitter, also non-electronic for those who don't use computers often)
- Better follow up and care for those within our church when going through something
- Outreach within the church (any members need help with yard work, etc.)
- Facility upgrades (fix floor in fellowship hall or completely redo the fellowship hall, better acoustics in fellowship hall, use the stage for more than storage, make upgrades to the carriage house, make more handicap accessible (elevator, etc.), put a new digital sign outside to advertise what is going on at church, a handicap accessible van to pick up members for church, etc.)
- Programs for all ages (singles, young adults, married no kids, widowed, etc.) (ex: sports teams to attract some)
- Partnership with other churches (interfaith activities)
- Grow new members
- Revitalize Stephen Ministry

Q4) What are your dreams for outside Lakeside?

- A local mission – something we can stand for and dedicate ourselves to that is close to Lakeside (some mentioned helping with homelessness, the opioid crisis, using our kitchen to help others, Life Learning Center, NKY Cold Shelter, using our talents to help others through Life Skills, finance help, learning to cook, tutoring, Helping refugees, Hispanics, etc.)
- More mission participation (not just giving money, but actually participating)
- Pick one main cause or a couple of related causes instead of trying to spread ourselves too thin over many causes
- Partner with the preschool and utilize lists from VBS and preschool to attract new members, partner on a mission, etc.
- Interfaith relationships and partnerships
- Youth choir tours
- Better with our PR, communications outside the church
- More groups using our space
