Out of the cacophony of demand...


Daily Devotional- Water & Spirit

Water and Spirit provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Resurrection of Our Lord/Vigil of Easter (traditionally known as Holy Saturday).



Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from the Gospel of John. The writers then bring their unique voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.


As you read the daily devotions, pause to think about how John describes water and the Spirit, and how water and the Spirit are at work in your life.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

**“God is our refuge and strength ... though the mountains shake.”
- Psalm 46:1-3**

The scale of the disaster facing Syria and Turkey after the Feb. 6 earthquake is becoming clearer. The 7.8-magnitude quake and its aftershocks have left more than 11,000 people dead and thousands more injured; these numbers will rise as search and rescue continues. Buildings have been reduced to rubble, and roads and bridges have been severely damaged, resulting in dangerous conditions for first responders. In some places, such as Aleppo, this destruction is compounding the damage of the now 11-year war in Syria.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas through long-standing partners in Syria, in addition to ACT Alliance members in Syria and Turkey, all of whom are already on the ground. PDA will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for building and resilience.

March Giving Barrel: Gift of the Heart

We are collecting items to make hygiene kits. PDA encourages congregations to participate in the ecumenical Gift of the Heart (GOH) Kits program. Hygiene, baby care, clean-up, and school supplies offer a way to reach disaster survivors and those in need with the hope of Christ.

Here the the items needed:

- hand towel (approximately 16" x 28", no fingertip or bath towels)
- washcloth
- wide-tooth comb (remove from package)
- nail clipper (UPDATE: nail clippers with metal files or emery boards attached are now accepted; remove from package)
- bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)

- toothbrush (in original packaging)
- Band-Aids® or other adhesive bandage strips

We look forward to worshipping, learning and serving with you as we call to God from "out of the deep" and draw deeply from the living well during this holy season.
